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Preface

Honourable Chief Minister Shri Bhupendra Patel's five years of good governance are being completed on 13th September 2026. From the state's largest-ever budget of ₹4.08 lakh crore to giving momentum to sustained development through semiconductors, solar energy, urban development, and modern infrastructure creation, Gujarat's five-year journey under the leadership of Chief Minister Shri Bhupendra Patel is not merely a statistical achievement, but a roadmap for the nation's future.

The 19 important policies that have determined the direction and pace of the state's development, the four Vibrant Gujarat Regional Conferences that have carried global investment to the regional level, and the ₹17.4 lakh crore worth of MoUs signed for investment across these four conferences, all stand as proof of Chief Minister Shri Bhupendra Patel's visionary and capable leadership. Through policies for sectors such as semiconductors, renewable energy, green hydrogen, electronics, spacetechnology, global capability centres, data centres, shipbuilding, and advanced manufacturing, Gujarat, under the Chief Minister's leadership, has laid a strong foundation for development in critical sectors of the future. Six semiconductor plants have been approved in Gujarat, of which three are now already operational on a commercial scale — an achievement no other state in the country has attained.

Under the Chief Minister's leadership, the Uniform Civil Code (UCC) Bill has been passed in Gujarat, strengthening the resolve for 'equality, justice, and unity'. Important administrative reforms have also been implemented to make services available to the state's citizens more efficient. 'Sugam Digital Gujarat' has been launched to make citizen services paperless, cashless, and faceless. International events such as G-20 meetings, the 10th edition of the Vibrant Gujarat Global Summit, and RE-Invest 2024 have been successfully hosted in Gujarat. Gujarat is now also eager and ready to host the Commonwealth Games in 2030.

Under the Chief Minister's leadership, the 'Gujarat State Institution for Transformation' (GRIT) has been set up on the pattern of the Centre's NITI Aayog, along with the Gujarat Administrative Reforms Commission (GARC), to enhance the efficiency and effectiveness of the state's administrative machinery. Honourable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has given the vision of 'Viksit Bharat @2047' for the year 2047, and in this context, Gujarat is the first state in the country to prepare a roadmap for 'Viksit Gujarat @2047'.

Carrying forward the vision for urban development of Gujarat's then Chief Minister and current Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, the year 2025 was declared as the Year of Urban Development. Priority has been given to urban development in order to equip the state's cities with modern, world-class infrastructure suited to future needs. To ensure that the state's daughters complete secondary and higher secondary education, the Chief Minister implemented the 'Namo Lakshmi Yojana', along with the 'Namo Saraswati Vigyan Sadhana Yojana', aimed at encouraging students to study science stream in Classes 11-12. To ensure that primary school children receive nutritious food in addition to the midday meal, the 'Mukhyamantri Paushtik Alpahar Yojana' has been implemented, along with the 'Namo Shree Yojana' to provide financial assistance for the health and nutrition of expectant mothers. To provide 'Ease of Living' to the state's citizens, the Chief

Minister has also implemented historic and significant revenue reforms. Under the Chief Minister's leadership, Gujarat is today moving rapidly towards becoming a leader in emerging sectors such as renewable energy, semiconductors, and artificial intelligence (AI). Over the past five years of his tenure, Gujarat has achieved development and accomplishments in every sector.

- Cyclone Biparjoy tackled with a zero-casualty approach

- Construction of 2,649 Amrit Sarovars completed in Gujarat, 107% of the target

01 Education Department

- National Education Policy 2020 effectively implemented in Gujarat
- Under Mission Schools of Excellence, work completed on 13,353 new classrooms, 21,000 new computer labs, 1,09,000 new smart classrooms, and 5,000 new STEM labs
- Successful hosting of the 24th edition of Kanya Kelavani Mahotsav and Shala Praveshotsav in 2026
- 'No Detention Policy' abolished in all schools in Gujarat
- Income limit raised for admission to Class 1 under the RTE Act
- Under the 2024 recruitment drive, a total of 9,400 Shikshan Sahayaks and 470 principals recruited in government and non-government grant-in-aid secondary and higher secondary schools; 2,230 existing teachers recruited/transferred
- 200 new composite schools, 95 new government secondary schools, and 3 higher secondary schools approved for 2026-27
- Since the launch of the 'Namo Lakshmi' scheme, more than 25 lakh girl students in the state have received assistance of over ₹2,110 crore
- Under the Namo Saraswati Vigyan Sadhana Yojana, more than 3.54 lakh students have received assistance of ₹290 crore since 2024-25
- Under the Chief Minister Gyan Sadhana Merit Scholarship Yojana, assistance of over ₹176 crore provided since 2023-24
- In the first term of 2025-26, a total of 1,271 students across 10 Raksha Shakti Schools — 529 in Class 6, 444 in Class 7, and 298 in Class 8 — received school voucher assistance of over ₹5 crore and 43 lakhs
- In the second term, a total of 1,218 students — 516 in Class 6, 418 in Class 7, and 284 in Class 8 — received school voucher assistance of over ₹5 crore and 20 lakhs
- 1,141 new teacher posts created to provide yoga and health education in the state's government primary schools
- The dropout rate for Classes 1 to 8 was 37.22% in 2001-02, which fell to just 2.35% in 2024-25
- 37 new resource rooms set up across the state, equipped with facilities such as advanced therapy equipment, digital panels, ramps, railings, and CwSN (Children with special needs) toilets
- The Education Department implemented an Artificial Intelligence (AI)-based Early Warning System (EWS) to identify students likely to drop out of school
- Out of nearly 1 crore students studying in government primary schools, EWS has so far identified around 1,68,000 students — less than 2% — who were counselled on completing their school education
- To ensure students in the state's remote and underserved areas get access to higher education closer to home, a total of 41 new government colleges were started over the last five years — 24 in non-tribal areas and 17 in tribal areas. In addition, new streams were introduced in 15 existing government colleges across non-tribal and tribal areas
- Under the Chief Minister Yuva Swavalamban Yojana, a total of 3,97,415 students received assistance of ₹2,068.67 crore over the last 5 years
- Under the Chief Minister Kanya Kelavani Nidhi Yojana, a total of 24,802 girl students received assistance of ₹797.01 crore over the last 5 years

- Under the Scheme of Developing High Quality Research (SHODH), students enrolled in PhD courses at recognised universities in Gujarat received total assistance of ₹113.52 crore over the last 5 years for quality research
- Under the Student Startup and Innovation Policy (SSIP) 2.0, financial assistance of up to ₹2.50 lakh was provided for 6,077 Proof of Concepts, resulting in the establishment of 962 startups from students' innovative ideas

02 Agriculture Department

- "Krishi Pragati" web portal and mobile app launched to boost farmers' development and agricultural activity
- Virtual inauguration of Banas Dairy's first indigenous semen centre
- For certifying agricultural land sale entries, only records after 6th April 1995 will be considered in farmer verification checks, simplifying cases involving sale entries and non-agricultural approvals
- Assistance under the Chief Minister Crop Storage Structure Yojana, which protects farmers' produce against various calamities, increased from ₹75,000 to ₹1,00,000
- Under the Chief Minister's guidance, to expand the reach of natural farming in Gujarat, the state government will adopt a 'cluster-based' approach to develop 500 villages as 'Natural Farming Villages'
- Important amendments made to the eligibility rules under the Chief Minister Gaumata Poshan Yojana, with a decision to bring the maximum possible number of the state's Panjrapoles and Gaushalas under the scheme
- Dang district became the state's first district to achieve 100 percent natural farming
- Index-A established to promote entrepreneurship in the agriculture sector and make agriculture-related information available on a central portal
- Farmers' data in Gujarat to remain 100 percent secure, with the Agriculture Department setting up a 'Departmental Data Committee'
- Around 16.88 lakh farmers in the state adopted micro-irrigation methods, covering an area of 25.81 lakh hectares
- By the end of 2025-26, 8 lakh farmers adopted natural farming across more than 8 lakh acres of land
- 66,871 farmers in Gujarat registered under the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Maandhan Yojana
- More than 20 lakh farmers in the state receive natural farming training annually
- Under the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi Yojana, an amount of ₹23,044.83 crore was credited directly into the bank accounts of 69.25 lakh farmer families through a total of 22 instalments
- Under the Minimum Support Price procurement scheme for agricultural produce, various produce was procured in 2025-26 at support prices, including more than 17.41 lakh metric tonnes of groundnut worth ₹12,646.97 crore, more than 3.66 lakh metric tonnes of chana worth ₹2,155.40 crore, and more than 80,565 metric tonnes of tuver worth ₹644.53 crore
- 8,69,922 farmers connected under the e-NAM portal in Gujarat, integrating 144 agricultural produce market yards across the state

- 10,291 traders and 7,191 commission agents registered on the e-NAM portal
- Soil Health Cards distributed to 2.25 crore farmers in Gujarat, making Gujarat the first state to implement this scheme
- Under the 4% interest subsidy scheme on KCC loans, an estimated 17 lakh farmers receive interest assistance every year
- A total of ₹11,915.25 crore in assistance has been paid out under this scheme over the last 12 years
- 66,871 farmers registered in Gujarat under the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Maandhan Yojana

03 Energy Department

- 11.47 lakh solar rooftop panels installed under the PM Surya Ghar Yojana, with consumers benefiting from a total subsidy of ₹5,908 crore so far
- Thanks to the successful implementation of the scheme, Gujarat now ranks consistently first in the country in solar rooftop installations, with a 20% contribution
- Under the Kisan Suryoday Yojana, more than 17,200 villages in the state (over 21 lakh farmers) receive electricity during regular daytime hours. The state government has spent more than ₹6,200 crore on this scheme so far
- With more than 1,108 CNG stations out of the country's total 8,980, Gujarat ranks among the top three states in the country
- 12 percent of the country's total CNG stations are in Gujarat
- 23 percent of the country's total domestic PNG connections, i.e. more than 39 lakh connections, are in Gujarat
- Foundation laid for the world's first CNG terminal, a brownfield port, in Bhavnagar
- More than 22,000 farmers in Gujarat installed off-grid solar pumps under the PM KUSUM Yojana. The state government paid farmers a subsidy of more than ₹650 crore under this scheme
- As of July 2026, Gujarat ranks first in India with an installed renewable energy capacity of 52.6 gigawatts, holding an 18% share of the country's total
- On the occasion of 'Good Governance Day' on 25th December 2025, the Energy Department launched three forward-looking policies: (1) Pumped Storage Policy, (2) Green Hydrogen Policy, and (3) Integrated Renewable Energy Policy
- BESS (Battery Energy Storage Systems) promoted to meet growing power demand and ensure efficient use of renewable energy
- Agreements signed so far for more than 5,500 MWh (megawatt-hour) of BESS storage capacity, with 400 MWh capacity already operational
- To ensure uninterrupted power supply along the border, an elevated XLPE-cabled power network covering 322.78 circuit kilometres and 58 BOPs (Border Out Posts) is planned to be set up in 2026-27 at an estimated cost of ₹101.16 crore
- 'Urja Sanvardhanam' portal launched as a data-driven forecasting and monitoring tool to modernise Gujarat's power infrastructure

- In the 14th Annual Integrated Ratings released by the Central Government, the state's power distribution companies ranked first across India, achieving an A+ rating
- MoUs worth more than ₹10 lakh crore signed during the Vibrant Gujarat Regional Conference

04 Urban Development Department

- A grand Vrindavan Gauchar Park to be constructed in Vadnagar at a cost of ₹15 crore
- Sanand, Kalol, Savli, Bardoli, and Hirasar to be developed as new satellite towns to ease pressure on Ahmedabad, Surat, Vadodara, and Rajkot
- More than 300 Town Planning (TP) schemes approved in the last 4 years
- Gujarat leads in the implementation of the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (Urban), with a total of 3.36 lakh houses completed since 2021
- 'Chief Minister Swarnim Jayanti Shahri Yojana' extended for a further three years, to promote 'Ease of Living' for Gujarat's citizens
- Under the Swarnim Jayanti Mukhyamantri Shehri Vikas Yojana, ₹20,399 crore allocated to 17 Municipal Corporations and ₹3,047 crore allocated to 152 Municipalities during 2021-22 to 2025-26
- Under the Smart City Mission, 185 projects worth more than ₹7,000 crore completed across the state's 6 smart cities
